But I make some hesitations, and my mistakes in grammar and pronunciation may sometimes make it hard for people to understand me.</p>	<p>I can...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read an e-mail from a friend cancelling a dinner date • Read and follow instructions for submitting a college application • Read a notice about construction in my neighbourhood • Read and compare health information from two different online sources <p>I understand predictable reading materials on topics that are relevant to me. But I cannot understand when the vocabulary and structures are complex.</p>	<p>I can...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a message to a colleague to cancel plans • Take notes in class to share with my classmate • Write an e-mail to ask for a refund for a product that did not work • Write two paragraphs to describe a familiar sequence of events <p>I can write short communications on routine familiar topics, and am starting to develop some control of more complex grammar. But, I still make mistakes and use awkward word combinations. I don't always use the right type of language for the situation.</p>
